TREAT YOURSELF TO THE LOUNGE LIFE

 Airport lounges aren't just for the traveling elite, they can be surprisingly affordable if booked in advance. Lounges offer a little slice of serenity in a busy and crowded airport.

You can wait for your flight in a relaxing atmosphere while enjoying free Wi-Fi, drinks, snacks and newspapers. Some of the swankier lounges even offer showers, spa services and a la carte dining.

The lounge life doesn't have to cost a small fortune, you can snap up great deals if you book ahead or buy a yearly membership. Also, be sure to check your credit card rewards, as some credit cards include complimentary access to lounges.



BRING YOUR OWN FOOD

 Food in the airport is nearly always outrageously expensive, so why not beat the system by packing a selection of snacks to eat before you board?

Pack an eco-friendly lunch box full of delicious snacks and treats and you'll be amazed at how much money you can save. Remember to pack dry snacks such as chips, nuts, cereal bars and chocolate, so that they make it through security.

A word of caution though, from experience, it can sometimes be tricky to find appropriate seating for snacking. Many food outlets understandably won't let you use their tables for your own snacks. This, unfortunately, means you might find yourself having a picnic in your lap in departures.

WEAR COMFY CLOTHES

If you aren't attempting to snag a flight upgrade by dressing smart, ditch the airport fashionista look and opt for comfy clothes instead. Layers are

your friend in an airport with overly aggressive air conditioning. You can add or remove, tops, jumpers, cardigans and coats while also saving on luggage space.

Don't be afraid to pack a onesie in your hand luggage for when you need that extra bit of warmth. I've seen many shameless travelers wandering around with bleary eyes in their pj's at 4 a.m. in the airport, so it's clearly an accepted practice.

BE ECO-FRIENDLY... BRING A REUSABLE WATER BOTTLE

Save money and reduce your plastic waste by traveling with a reusable water bottle on your next trip. Many airports now have refill stations in departures, so you can save money on pricey bottled water. You'll also be doing your part to reduce single-use plastics. Reward your eco-efforts immediately with a large slice of cake, you've earned it.

PACK WISELY

Are you off on a short break? Try and take just a cabin bag if you can, you'll be able to whiz through the airport and avoid the long lines at the check-in desk. The key to great travel packing is to look stylish while not overpacking and saving space in your luggage. Make sure to also pick a lightweight case on wheels for optimal airport navigation. You'll also be able to breeze around your new destination with ease.



Bringing a laptop? Make sure it's in an easy-to-access place so you don't have to rummage around your case in the security queue to retrieve it.

BOOK YOUR AIRPORT PARKING IN ADVANCE

Driving to the airport? Keep your car secure and safe while you are on your travels by booking airport **PARKING** parking. There is a large range of airport parking

options and you should take the time to research the best one for you. A little forward planning can also save you time, money and stress. Choose from official airport car parks, meet and greet, park and ride and hotel parking.

The key to all of these options is to book well in advance. If you turn up to park on the day of your flight, you are

going to get charged an eye-watering amount. Instead, book ahead of time and you could save up to 70% on airport parking. I would recommend checking out parking deals on price comparison sites to see what works best for you.

Another top tip is to take a picture of your parking spot and any identifying signage before rushing off to the terminal. This will save you so much time when you return and are able to locate your vehicle with ease.



BRING PORTABLE CHARGERS

• If you are an avid Instagrammer like me, having a portable charger for your devices can be a lifesaver when you are low on juice and there are no available power outlets at the airport. Keep all your devices charged when you are on the go by investing in a semi-decent portable charger. You can compare models and prices on tech sites to see which is the best option for you.



CARRY YOUR OWN WET WIPES

 Wet wipes are a multi-purpose godsend in an airport, especially right now. They can be used to freshen up, remove makeup and wipe down spaces in public areas. You can even buy travelsized packs and save space in your hand

Have a pack of anti-bacterial wipes at close access and you can give water fountains, food trays and restroom handles a little wipe down before you use them and have extra peace of mind.



GET YOUR TRAVEL DOCUMENTS IN ORDER

 Always have your passport and boarding card in a safe and easy-toaccess place in your hand luggage. This will save you from emptying out your bag on the floor or having a complete meltdown that you have left them at the airport bar.

Also, be sure to carry printed copies of any car rental confirmation, hotel reservations, resort transfer details in case your phone dies, or if you are asked to show these details to airport staff. If you have any visas or documentation for your trip, I recommend you organize it into an easily accessible travel wallet and keep it somewhere safe!

TAKE A PHOTO OF **YOUR SUITCASE**

 One of the simplest and most effective airport hacks is simply taking a snap of your suitcase.

Having a photo of your luggage on your phone will come in handy in the dreaded case of lost luggage. A further tip is to try and have a case that stands out or has easily identifiable features. This will reduce the chances of

■ The U.S. Capitol Christmas Tree

Every year, a tree from a National Forest in the United States decorates the West Lawn of the Capitol. This year the tree will come from Northern California's Six Rivers National Forest.

■ Visit the National Christmas Tree

The National Christmas Tree is a large evergreen located in the northeast quadrent of The Ellipse park near the White House. A tree is decorated every year since 1923 and put on display for all to enjoy. It is traditionally lit by the President of the United States. The tree is adorned with handcrafted ornaments from 56 U.S. states and territories. The site is free to visit from 10:00 a.m.-10:00 p.m. every day during the holiday season.

Arlington National Cemetery is the largest military cemetery in the United States. More than 400,000 military veterans and their immediate family members rest here. Each year the cemetery partakes in National Wreaths Across America Day where wreaths are laid across every headstone (this year it will be December 18, 2021). If you can attend in person, you are able to volunteer to assist placing wreaths on the graves of our soldiers.

ZooLights Express

ZooLights Express is the Smithsonian's National Zoo's beloved holiday installation and they are now bringing the festive lights to the DC community! This year, there will be a 24-foot Zoolights Express truck merrily decorated with holiday light displays and it's very own "Panda Claws". A HAWAIIAN CHRISTMAS

Prior to celebrating Christmas, the people of Hawai'i had their own celebration known as Makahiki. Makahiki historically lasted from the months of October to February. It was a time when all wars among the Hawaiian people were strictly forbidden and it ushered in an essence of "peace and goodwill towards men". Makahiki was a time to recover and strengthen emotionally, mentally and physically. Makahiki is still celebrated today with games, food and festivities as well as provisions to various charities being a central piece.

PRIOR TO CELEBRATING CHRISTMAS, THE PEOPLE OF HAWAI'I HAD THEIR OWN CELEBRATION KNOWN AS MAKAHIKI.

The first documented Christmas in Hawai'i was in 1786 when George Dixon, Captain of the Queen Charlotte merchant ship, celebrated with a large Christmas dinner for him and his crew. Moving forward, Christmas celebrations in Hawai'i varied due to the ever-expanding lineage of missionaries and evangelists who would come to the islands bringing with them their own versions of holiday traditions. On December 25, 1856, King Kamehameha IV declared Christmas a national holiday.

Today, Hawaiians celebrate Christmas in many different ways. We spoke with some locals to discover a few of their favorite ways the islands celebrate this special holiday season.

■ Hawaiian Christmas Trees

When you're far away from the white snow and close to the white sand you have to adapt to a different style of Christmas tree. Instead of the customal decked-out evergreen conifers, you will find decorated Norfolk Pines all over thislands. These are typically decorated with beautiful, fresh flowers but you will also see them with traditional Christma ornaments and bulbs. Decorated Palm trees are also an acceptable alternative to the mainland Evergreens.



Hawaiian Christmas Dinner

Christmas dinner is a staple for every home this time of year, but in Hawai'i, it looks slightly different. A typical Christmas on the islands will have Kalua pig as the main dish and sides such as sticky rice, chicken long rice and squid luau. Customary desserts include Poi, a Samoan dessert made from overripe bananas and coconut milk and Halo-halo, a Filipino dessert that is served cold and made with shaved ice, evaporated milk, syrup and a variety of fruits.

■ Christmas Lights at Honolulu Hale

Arguably one of the best holiday displays in Hawai'i, Honolulu City Lights at Honolulu Hale is a month-long display of Christmas lights and decorations. This annual exhibition includes a large outdoor adorned Yuletide tree, a 21-foot tall Shaka Santa and Mrs. Clause, an indoor tree display and a corridor of wreaths. The trees feature Hawaiian style and made ornaments that are available to purchase in smaller sizes for you to take home.

The heart of Christmas remains the same regardless of if you are celebrating on the mainland or on the islands. The holiday season traditions adapt to their surroundings to produce experiences unique to each location. No matter where you are this holiday season, we wish you a Mele Kalikimaka (or as we mainlanders say "Merry Christmas)! If you need help pronouncing Mele Kalikimaka check out Bing Crosby's famous Christmas song of the same title.



he city of Beijing will be in the unique position of being the first location in Olympic history to host both the Summer and Winter Olympic Games. After hosting the Summer edition previously in 2008, China will welcome the athletic talent of the world once again 14 years later. A total of 109 medal events across seven Olympic winter sports will

be held across three competition zones all in 16 days of action.

WHAT TO EXPECT

ALPINE SKIING

Alpine Skiing, also known as downhill skiing, is the pastime of sliding down snow-covered slopes on skis that are with fixed-heel bindings, opposed to other styles of skiing that use skis with free-heel bindings. Competitors regularly reach speeds of up to 95 mph all while navigating a winding course that holds sharp turns and jumps.

HOCKEY


With the return of professional athletes to the ice, both Canada's and the United State's women are expected to secure the gold for the 2022 Olympics. On the men's side, the battle between the two neighbors is expected to be fierce and both teams have drawn the same group. Patrick Kane will lead the way for the US and Sidney Crosby for Canada.

CURLING

Curling is one of the more unique sports at the Winter Olympics. It involves stones, brooms, a 'slider' and 'gripper' shoe. While curling may be a 'slow' sport, it's still full of skill, suspense and excitement!

FIGURE SKATING

The Japanese are expected to dominate in both the men's and women's competitions; however, the USA may have something to say about that as former bronze medalist, Nathan Chen, has recently made great strides. On the women's side, the USA's Bradie Tennell also won bronze last time and could be a dark horse this year.



OLYMPIC NEWS

- The venues for Beijing 2022 have been divided into three zones: Beijing, Yanqing,
- There are new events for 2022 including Women's Monobob men and women), Short Track Speed Skating Mixed Relay, Ski Jumping Mixed Team, Freestyle Skiing Aerials Mixed Team and Snowboard Cross Mixed Team.
- If you're an ice hockey fan, note down February 17 and 20 as these are the dates of the gold medal matches for the women's competition and men's competition, respectively.
- Often times you will see previous Olympic winners at current Olympic competitions. Rumor has it, Lindsey Vonn will be in attendance at the 2022 Beijing Winter Olympics to cheer on

LOOKING BACK AT **CELEBRATED WINTER OLYMPIANS**

LINDSEY VONN | Alpine Skiing, Gold 2010

Lindsey took home gold for downhill skiing and bronze in the Super-G portion of Alpine skiing at the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Winter Games.

APOLO OHNO

Short Track Speed Skater Gold 2002 & 2006

Apolo competed in three Olympics and won eight Olympic medals in total (two gold, two silver, four bronze). He was inducted into the US Olympic Hall of Fame in 2019 and his skates are on display at the Smithsonian.

SARAH HUGHES

Singles Figure Skating Gold 2002

Sarah Elizabeth Hughes was a Team USA Olympic Figure Skater. She won gold in Salt Lake City after she launched herself from fourth place to win the gold with one of the biggest upsets in Olympic figure skating history.

TEAM USA | Hockey, Gold 1980

Known as the greatest upset in Olympic history, the "Miracle on Ice" game during the Winter Olympics in Lake Placid, New York made history that won't soon be forgotten. The game was played between the hosting United States and the Soviet Union with the Soviet Union expected to dominate. With seconds to go, the United States' Olympic Hockey Team defeated the Soviet Union with a final score of 4-3 in an unbelievable play.

ABBY ROQUE | Hockey

One of the most decorated college hockey players in recent history, Roque will be making her Olympic debut in Beijing for the 2022 Winter Olympics. Originally from Michigan, she currently plays for team Minnesota in the PWHPA.

• MIKAELA SHIFFRIN | Alpine Skiing

Receiving her first gold medal at age 19 during the 2014 Sochi Olympics, Mikaela brings fierce competition to the Alpine Skiing sector of the 2022 Olympics. With two Olympic gold medals and four 2021 World Championship medals, she is one of the top skiers to watch in Beijing.

• NATHAN CHEN | Figure Skating

Originally from Salt Lake City, Chen entered his first skating competition in 2003 at the age of 4. A three-time world champion, a 2018 Olympic bronze medal and an additional nine medals from several other skating competitions are what Nathan Chen brings to the 2022 Olympics.

• CHLOE KIM | Snowboarding

Chloe Kim is originally from sunny Long Beach, California but has been tearing up the snowy slopes in the mountains of California since age 4. Competing since age 6, she has won six X-Games gold medals and is the first woman to received two gold medals at the Winter Youth Olympic Games. At the 2018 Winter Olympics, she became the youngest woman to win Olympic gold when she took the gold at the women's snowboard halfpipe at just 17 years old.

ALYSA LIU | Figure Skating

This 16-year-old prodigy was a two-time national figure skating champion by age 13. She is also the 2021 CS Lombardia Trophy holder. Her talent is so great, even Tara Lipinski has called her "the future of U.S. women's skating."

Toby Miller is an 18-year-old snowboarder who has been mentored by the renowned Shaun White. Toby has been gaining attention in the snowboarding world for several years, receiving USASA National titles and big-time sponsorship deals at the young age of 13. The 2022 Winter Olympics will be Toby's first.

Zhou began skating at age 5 and has since won over ten medals across various skating competitions. He finished 6th place at Pyeong Chang Winter Olympics and is aiming higher

WHEN & **WHERE** TO WATCH THE GAMES

he 2022 Beijing Winter Olympics are scheduled to start with the Opening Ceremony on February 4th and wrap up with Closing Ceremonies on February 20th. Beijing hosted the Summer Olympics in 2008 but this will be the first time that they are hosting.

Keep in mind, Beijing is 12 hours ahead of the Eastern Time Zone. That means opening ceremonies will be in the morning hours of February 4th.

NBC and its platforms own the rights to air the Olympics. This means you will find everything Olympics related on your local NBC station, the streaming service Peacock, NBC Sports and NBCOlympics.com.

SlingTV will also have its own Olympic channel as well as YouTube TV and Hulu + Live TV.

here are several fabulous ski resorts within driving distance of Denver, but which are the best? Here are our top picks.

■ Vail

Beautiful Vail.

Top of the list is Vail. It takes about two hours and ten minutes to drive from Denver airport to Vail, but it is definitely worth the drive. Vail is a skier's paradise!

Vail covers a vast area and has a great variety of terrain. There are some lovely, easy green trails (or beginner trails) around Game Creek, lots of cruisy blues everywhere, some

challenging black runs for the more advanced skier and then there are the bowls! Powder days in the back bowls of Vail provide the best skiing experience you could ever imagine.

Lifts go from Vail Village and its close neighbor, Lionshead, and the slopes are easily accessed from these bases. There is ample parking in both locations, but it is expensive.

There are plenty of places to eat in the resort villages as well as on the mountain itself. The Two Elk Lodge, an enormous log cabin structure, is a destination favorite, but there are several other outlets too, especially around mid-Vail.

■ Breckenridge

Breckenridge is slightly closer to Denver than Vail and is another wonderful resort. Known affectionately as "Breck" by regular visitors, at 3,914 m Breckenridge claims to be the highest resort in North America.

Like Vail, Breck has something for everyone. The ski resort consists of 5 peaks (numbered from 6 to 10 inclusive) and each has its own character. Peak Six is often left ungroomed and there are well-spaced trees on some of the runs for an added challenge; Peak 10 has mostly Black Runs, some long, steep and groomed, others made up of thigh-burning bump fields. There are lots of easier runs and beginner slopes towards the bottom of the resort.

There is paid parking at the base of the gondola, which gives easy access to the slopes. Alternatively, there is free parking a couple of miles away on Airport Road from which shuttles ferry skiers to the gondola.

There are plenty of places to eat on the mountain. All are perfectly acceptable but the top choice is Ten Mile Station at the base of Peak 10.

Breckenridge is a real town and not as manicured as Vail, but it is characterful and well worth wandering around. Breck also hosts the annual Snow Sculpture Festival, a must-go if you are in the area.

Keystone

The drive to Keystone takes a little over two hours from the Denver airport. There is plenty of free parking in Keystone, but it is a fair walk through the village to reach the lifts. Fortunately, carts for pulling skis along are available and free of charge.

Keystone is another resort with its own unique character. The resort has three mountains, Dercum Mountain, North Peak and The Outback. They are all inter-connected by lifts and Keystone is one of the easiest resorts to navigate. The Outback is the most challenging area and is particularly good for glade skiing.

The village has less to offer than either Breckenridge or Vail, but there are plenty of places to eat on the mountain, The Outpost on North Peak being particularly good.

OTHER GREAT RESORTS TO CHECK OUT

There are several other resorts within driving distance of Denver. Winter Park, Copper Mountain and Arapahoe Basin are especially recommended. Although a slightly longer drive, Beaver Creek is also a fabulous resort.

Discovering Lindsey:

5 QUESTIONS ANSWERED ABOUT THE EVOLUTION OF OLYMPIC WINNER, LINDSEY VONN.

C9: After attending your first Winter Olympics in 2002, at the young age of 17, you managed a 6th place finish in combined. At the 2010 Olympics, you went on to achieve a lifelong dream and took gold. You displayed through your own achievements that hard work and perseverance will bring your dreams to fulfillment. Based on your own experience, what words of advice do you have for the young Olympians who will be competing at the 2022 Winter Olympics?

LV: The advice I have for young Olympians is to focus on why they love the sport they're competing in, and to give it their all without fear and without holding back. If you don't give it everything you have you'll regret it. I always say that I'd rather not finish a race giving it 100% than finishing a race knowing I could have given more. So, enjoy the moment and give it everything you can. If you can do that, you can't go wrong.

C9: While preparing for this interview, I saw a pattern I just couldn't ignore. You have faced so many obstacles, both in your career and personal life, and have come out blazing each time. You are truly amazing. What has motivated you to continually get up after each setback with such fierceness?

LV: My motivation has always been rooted in the passion I have for my sport. I never saw skiing as a job or work. So, when I faced injuries and obstacles, I worked as hard as I could to get back to what I loved to do. Obstacles, while difficult, also gave me a different perspective and allowed me to appreciate success on a much deeper level. I would not be the person I am today, had I not gone through all of the ups and downs.

C9: You have been admirably open about the struggles of transitioning into retirement, can you give us an update as to what you've been up to and how you are feeling since making the difficult decision to retire?

LV: Retiring from the sport I love definitely hasn't been easy for me, but I'm doing great now. I've been working on my memoir 'Rise'

over the past couple of years. The writing process has really helped me reflect and appreciate the journey my skiing career took me on. Retirement has also given me more time that I didn't have before to focus on other areas of my life including business, investing, and fashion. I am still working with Under Armour, Rolex and Land Rover and have been active in investing and advising in businesses that I feel passionate about like Hyperice and Oura Ring. I have also become a GP and LP of a few venture capital funds. Exploring my creative side, I have worked closely with Ynig to design luxury ski goggles and also my new Legacy Collection ski-wear line that just launched with Head Sportswear. Staying busy and finding new challenges is in my DNA. I'm very happy with where I am now and thankful for the opportunities I've worked hard to cultivate.

C9: Cloud9 will have an article published in this edition discussing our top 3 picks for skiing around Denver. Do you have a top 3 favorite ski areas near Denver you would like to share with us? Why are they your favorite?

LV: My top 3 favorite ski areas near Denver would be Steamboat, Telluride and Vail. One of my first family ski trips was to "Retiring from the sport

Steamboat and I have special memories there. Telluride has exceptional terrain and is more of a hidden gem. Vail was my home for many, many years and I will always love it.

C9: You created the Lindsey Vonn Foundation in 2015 with the intention of helping young girls achieve their dreams, can you tell us a little more about your foundation, how we can support it and what your goals for 2022 are?

LV: I remember when I met Picabo Street. how in awe I was of her and how much she inspired me to chase after my dreams. I really hope I can be like Picabo and give young kids the inspiration to be the best they can be. That is the premise behind my foundation, but I started it because I feel that success is meaningless unless you can pass it down. I want the younger generation to embrace who they are, define their future and change the world. All of the donations go towards programs, camps, scholarships, and speaker series that allow kids to build their skills, confidence, and their support system as they work to achieve their goals. 


■ The Original Farmer's Market

The diversity of food you will discover at The Original Farmer's Market, including American, Latino, Asain and more, reflect the diversity of the city of Los Angeles itself.








Angeles National Forest




