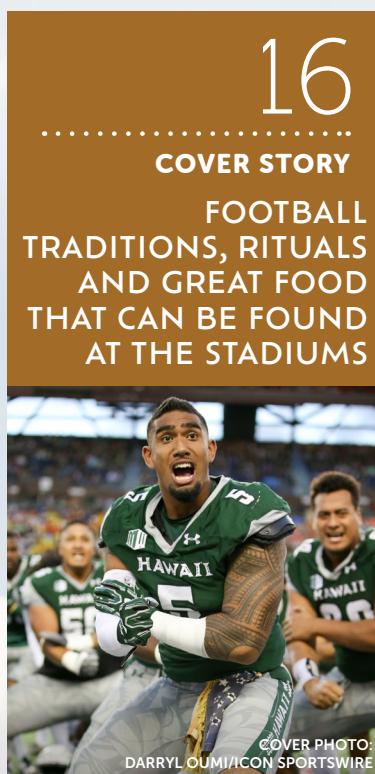

CEO Stan Little: New Routes, New Planes, New Adventures Await!



Stan Little: Southern Airways/Mokulele Chairman and CEO

The airline business is set up so that nothing happens fast. It's a highly-regulated, very systemic industry designed to ensure the highest level of safety, but we know that sometimes you, our customer, may get frustrated with the speed at which things move. I am pleased to announce today that multiple Southern & Mokulele projects are coming to fruition at once—many of them after months or even years of work!

If you're flying with us in Hawaii, be sure to look for our new **Flagship** aircraft, the 30-seat Saab 340. One of them is already flying routes between Molokai, Lanai, and Honolulu, and the next one will be on its way across the Pacific soon. These aircraft will eventually allow us to increase our capacity in the islands by up to 30%.

Also in the Pacific are our brand new Tecnam Travelers. These twin-engine piston planes are the launch aircraft for our new brand in the Far Pacific, *Marianas Southern Airways*. From our hub in Saipan, Southern now serves Tinian, Rota, and Guam as the only airline with daily service among all four of these American islands.

IN THE PACIFIC ARE OUR BRAND NEW TECNAM TRAVELERS. THESE TWIN-ENGINE PISTON PLANES ARE THE LAUNCH AIRCRAFT FOR OUR NEW BRAND IN THE FAR PACIFIC, *MARIANAS SOUTHERN AIRWAYS*. FROM OUR HUB IN SAIPAN, SOUTHERN NOW SERVES TINIAN, ROTA, AND GUAM AS THE ONLY AIRLINE WITH DAILY SERVICE AMONG ALL FOUR OF THESE AMERICAN ISLANDS.

On the continent, Southern this month launches new service between Phoenix and Show Low, Arizona on the Pilatus PC-12. This pressurized 9-seat aircraft allows us to safely fly in the high elevations of the Arizona desert by reaching altitudes up to 20,000 feet. It's another example of Southern finding the equipment to adapt to the mission.

With these new aircraft all coming online within just a few weeks of one another, Southern will have added a total of four new fleet types from four different manufacturers in four separate countries—all in a single year. That's a feat not accomplished by any other carrier in the history of American aviation. (In case you're wondering, the Saab is Swedish, the PC12 is Swiss, the Tecnam is Italian, and the KingAir is made right here in the US of A.)

On the pilot front, you've likely seen the stories on the news about the mass cancellations and general chaos happening at airports worldwide. While Southern and Mokulele are not completely immune to these disruptions, the impact has been much less on us than on our larger partners. Our pilot pipeline remains robust, with nearly 60 new crew members currently in the training process and new pilots joining our ranks daily.

As you see our pilots and customer service staff while flying, please take a moment to say hello or just offer a smile. Our 700 employees are working overtime to safely get you to your destination, and many of them haven't gotten much time off this summer. They have my gratitude for working so hard, as do you for flying Southern and Mokulele!

Grape Jello Prepared
Strawberry Jello Prepared
1 1/2 oz. Vodka
Ice

Add Jello to a tall glass, just a bit of each, doesn't need to be in squares. Add ice, vodka, and soda. Stir GENTLY. Now take a spoon, turn it upside down over the drink and slowly pour. The red will stick to the foam giving it a true "bloody" look.

THANKSGIVING ACROSS THE REGIONS WITH SOUTHERN AIRWAYS



BAY SPICED ROASTED TURKEY

This bay spiced turkey recipe by Eating Well will give you the classic Mid-Atlantic flavors of bay leaf, mustard and sweet paprika. Your Thanksgiving dinner will take you on a journey through Maryland with just one bite.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 To prepare Bay Spice Blend (if desired), combine all ingredients in a medium bowl. To prepare the brine, combine water, salt, sugar, onions, celery and spice blend in a large stock pot. Bring to a boil over high heat, stirring to dissolve the salt and sugar. Let cool to room temperature. Then stir in ice-cold water and ice. Remove neck and giblets from turkey and discard. Add the turkey to the brine; weight it with a plate, if necessary, so it stays submerged. Cover and refrigerate for at least 8 hours and no longer than 16 hours before you plan to serve your turkey.
- 2 To rub & roast turkey: About 3 1/2 to 4 hours before you want to serve the turkey, remove it from the brine and thoroughly rinse with cool water. (Discard the brine.) Pat dry with paper towels.
- 3 Combine 1/3 cup spice blend, 1 teaspoon salt and lemon zest in a small bowl. (There should be enough spice blend left for the stuffing.) Rub the mixture under the skin on the turkey breast, thighs and legs and inside the cavity as evenly as possible without tearing the skin. Rub the outside of the turkey with oil. Stuff the cavity with shallots and the zested lemon halves.
- 4 Coat a rack with cooking spray and place it in a roasting pan. Place the turkey on the rack, breast-side down, and let stand at room temperature for 30 minutes.
- 5 Meanwhile, preheat oven to 400 degrees F.
- 6 Roast the turkey for 30 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees, add 2 cups hot water to the pan to prevent the drippings from burning and roast for 30 minutes more.
- 7 Remove the turkey from the oven and very carefully turn it breast-side up. Then continue roasting until an instant-read thermometer inserted into the thickest part of a thigh without touching bone registers 165 degrees F, 30 minutes to 1 hour more. (If the turkey is larger than 14 pounds, add 3 to 6 minutes more roasting time for each additional pound.)
- 8 Transfer the turkey to a clean cutting board, leaving the drippings in the pan. Tent the turkey with foil to keep warm and let rest while you prepare the gravy.
- 9 To prepare gravy: Set the roasting pan over two burners on medium-high heat; add diced onion, thyme and bay leaf and cook, stirring and scraping up any browned bits, until the onion is soft, about 4 minutes. Add wine, bring to a boil over medium-high heat and cook until reduced by about half, 6 to 8 minutes. Carefully strain the liquid through a fine sieve and return the strained liquid to the roasting pan over medium-high heat. Combine broth and cornstarch in a measuring cup and slowly whisk into the liquid in the pan. Add 2 cups water and celery root (or parsnips) and cook, whisking constantly, until the vegetables are tender and the gravy is thickened, about 10 minutes. Remove from the heat; stir in chives and white pepper.
- 10 Carve the turkey and serve with gravy.

INGREDIENTS

BAY SPICE BLEND

- 1/4 cup dry mustard
- 8 whole bay leaves, finely crushed
- 2 tablespoons crushed red pepper
- 2 tablespoons celery seed
- 2 tablespoons ground ginger
- 1 1/2 tablespoons dried thyme
- 1 tablespoon sweet paprika
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon ground mace or nutmeg
- 1 tablespoon freshly ground pepper
- 2 teaspoons onion powder

CELERY ROOT PAN GRAVY

- 1/2 cup finely diced onion
- 2 sprigs fresh thyme
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 cup dry white wine
- 2 cups low-sodium turkey or chicken broth or stock
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 2 cups water
- 1 1/2 cups finely diced peeled celery root or parsnips
- 1/4 cup snipped fresh chives
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground white pepper, or to taste

BRINE & TURKEY

- 1 gallon water
- 1 cup kosher salt
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 medium onions, sliced
- 1 head celery, cut into 3-inch lengths
- 1/2 cup of the Bay Spice Blend
- 8 cups ice-cold water
- 4 cups ice cubes
- 112- to 14- pound turkey

TURKEY RUB

- 1/3 cup of the Bay Spice Blend
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 2 lemons, zested then halved, divided
- 1 tablespoon canola oil
- 4 shallots, halved

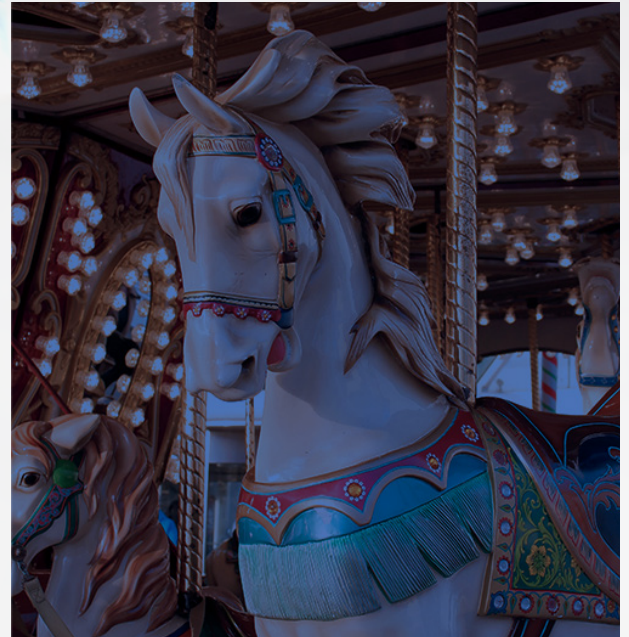

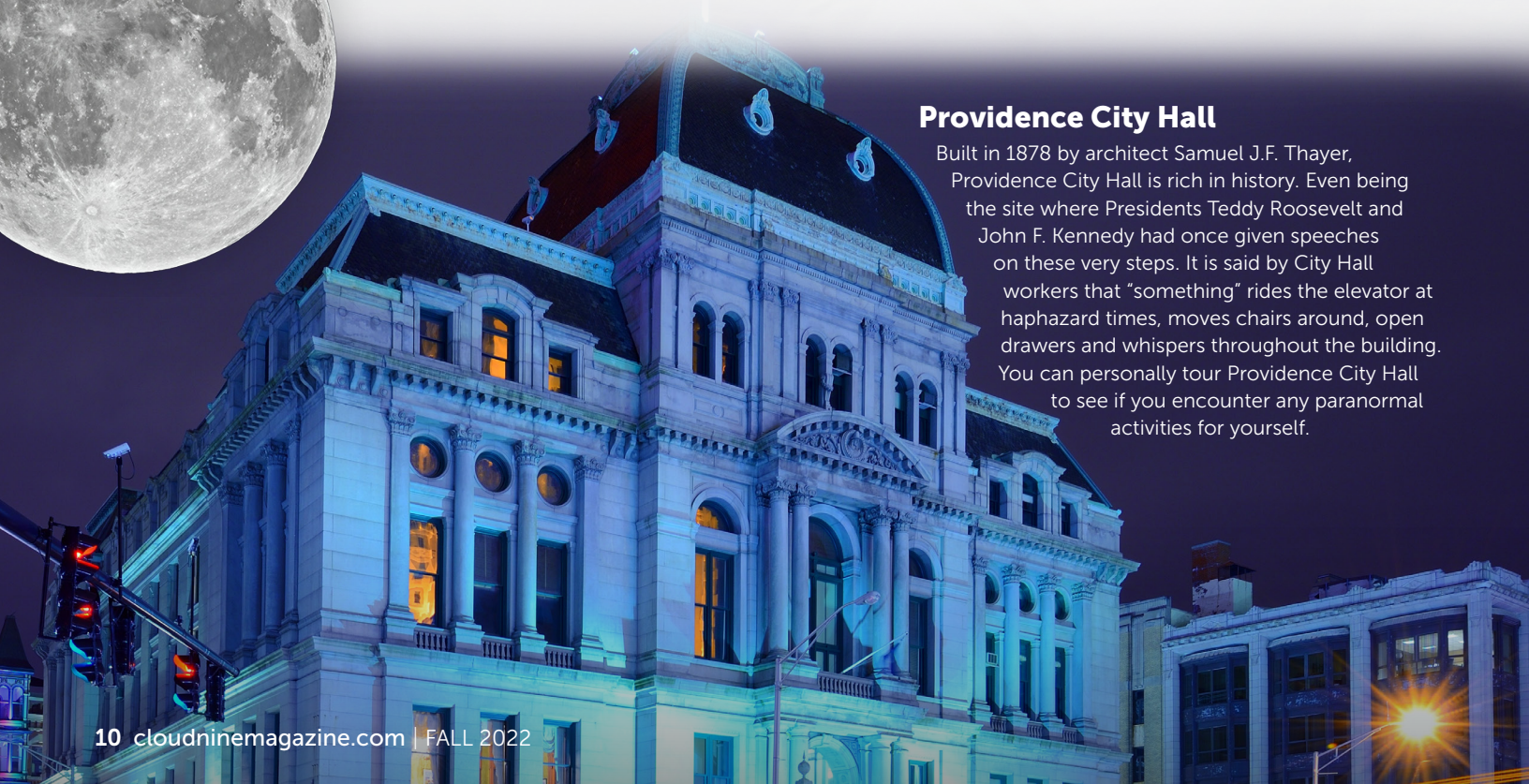


Crescent Park Loeff Carousal

This hand-carved carousel was built in 1895 by Charles I. D. Loeff at his Brooklyn, New York factory. It is now located in Crescent Park in the Riverside section of East Providence. It is said that the spirits of those who perished in a major nearby fire in the 1960s haunts the ride by turning the music on at random, flashing the lights and employees have even reported seeing nearby apparitions of a woman in a hoop skirt.

Providence City Hall

Built in 1878 by architect Samuel J.F. Thayer, Providence City Hall is rich in history. Even being the site where Presidents Teddy Roosevelt and John F. Kennedy had once given speeches on these very steps. It is said by City Hall workers that "something" rides the elevator at haphazard times, moves chairs around, open drawers and whispers throughout the building. You can personally tour Providence City Hall to see if you encounter any paranormal activities for yourself.

Just a few short minutes down the road from Hanscom (BED) sits the historic location of Concord, MA. The site of the first battles of the Revolutionary War. Home to such influential poets and novelists like Ralph Waldo Emerson, Henry David Thoreau and many more. Concord isn't just full of history, it also has a long history of ghostly activity.

Haunted Tour of Concord

Coming from Hanscom, your first stop on a haunted tour of Concord is the Old North Bridge. Step out into the parking lot by the Old North Bridge and you will see the Robbins House. By day it is a wonderful memorial depicting the history of Concord's African American community. By night there are stories of misty figures roaming the property, but that is only the start. Cross the street and you will come to a walkway leading to the Old North Bridge. Ghosts of America's early struggles for independence have been seen crossing the bridge, while other stories tell of seeing shadowy figures, perhaps those of the British Soldiers and provincials who died at the start of the Battles of Lexington and Concord.



Minute Man National Park

Further venturing into history we come to Minute Man National Park. The park not only houses relics from the Revolutionary War but it is the site for the Wayside Home of Authors and more recently it is frequented by paranormal investigation groups. Ghost hunting is not limited to adults. The park even offers a Halloween Lantern Walk through the roads to meet the spirits of 1775.

Sleepy Hollow Cemetery

The next stop on the haunted tour of Concord is to a cemetery. It isn't hard to imagine a cemetery being creepy but with a name like Sleepy Hollow, how could it not be haunted? Sleepy Hollow Cemetery is the final resting place for many famous and notable people. Author's Ridge alone is where you can find the graves of Emerson, Thoreau, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Louisa May Alcott, William Ellery Channing, and some of the most frequent haunted happenings. Misty figures, moving shadows, and faint voices have all been reported on the grounds of this early American cemetery.

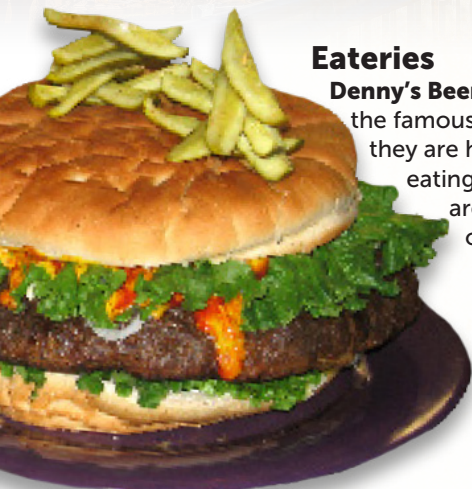
Foliage Drives

Cheesman Park

Cheesman Park is one of the most popular parks in the Denver area. You will discover people strolling on beautiful days, picnics being had and pleasant memories being made; however, what you don't see at first glance is the fact that the park was built on top of an old burial ground in 1898. The cemetery was initially created for the "undesirable" citizens – outlaws, the poorer of the local population and those who died from infectious diseases. Human remains have been discovered at the park as recently as 2008 when road workers stumbled upon them while doing routine maintenance. It is reported that over 2,000 spirits still roam the grounds, some of them angry that their graves were moved during the park's development. Many people today report a spell of overwhelming sadness while moving throughout the park, endless reports of ghostly sightings including spirits who appears confused, children playing and a woman singing to herself. Sounds of moaning and groaning have also been reported in the park at night.

The Molly Brown House Museum

You may have heard her referred to as the Unsinkable Molly Brown due to her heroic efforts to get passengers off of the famous Titanic as it sank. Molly Brown and her husband, J.J. Brown, were both travelers on the Titanic that fateful night, J.J. Brown sank with the Titanic but Molly managed to survive. At the time of the Titanic disaster, Molly and J.J. lived in this very house in Denver. Originally built in 1887, it was due for demolition in 1970 before it was saved by Historic Denver Inc. The home has since been converted into a museum where ghostly sightings have been experienced over the years. There is a strict no-smoking policy and yet random whiffs of cigars are reported from around the home. It was well known that J.J. Brown so famously loved to smoke from his cigar pipe. Perhaps, the smoky scents of today is J.J. himself indulging in one of his favorite pastimes. Shadowy figures have been reported moving throughout the house, one, in particular, a woman in a Victorian-era style dress who seems to have a fondness for rearranging the furniture throughout the museum. This apparition is said to be none other than Molly Brown herself. Along with any haunted site, reports of unexplained coldness and taps on the shoulders are experienced by visitors and staff alike.

OXFORD, MS

Home Of Ole Miss – The Grove is a Southern Football Tradition like no other. Once serving as a recreation field during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, the grove began to evolve during the 1950s as fans started gathering there on Saturdays. Now adorned with hundreds of red and blue tents and tables providing some of the tastiest food ever tasted, The Grove is a must-visit for any football fan.

MORGANTOWN, WV

Home of the Mountaineers – Legendary musician John Denver’s “Country Roads,” has been performed at every home football pre-game show since 1972. The song is also played after every home victory and fans are encouraged to stay in the stands to sing along with the team. “Country Roads” is also the WVU Theme song.

FAYETTEVILLE, AR

Home of the Razorbacks- Time to Call The Hogs! One of the most deafening and recognizable college football chants. Now, you may ask, “What the heck is that?” It’s pretty simple: Raise your arms above your head during the The Hog Call, yell “Wooo” and wiggle your fingers for a few seconds. Next, bring both arms straight down with fists clenched while yelling, “Pig.” Then extend your right arm with the “Sooie.” Repeat these steps two more times and finish by yelling “Razor-Backs” like this:

HONOLULU

Home Of The Rainbow Warriors – Before 1923, UH teams were nicknamed the “Deans.” Then in the final game of the 1923 season, UH head coach Otto Klum’s squad upset Oregon State, 7-0, at Mo’ili’ili Field. During the game, a rainbow appeared over the field. Reporters started calling UH teams the Rainbows and the tradition began that Hawai’i would not lose a game if a rainbow appeared. The theme of the hit TV series “Hawai’i 5-O” is their theme song. 20 minutes before each game The Warrior Ha’a – a traditional Māori dance, was performed by the team for many seasons, and then wasn’t. According to The University of Hawai’i Athletic Department that tradition returned in the Spring game this year and will be performed moving forward.

As a tribute to the legend, Show Low's main street is named "Deuce of Clubs".

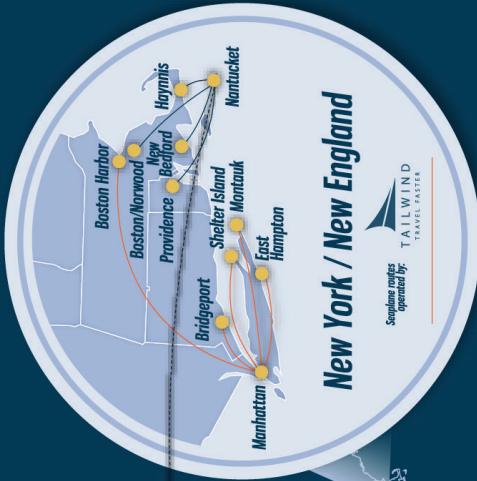

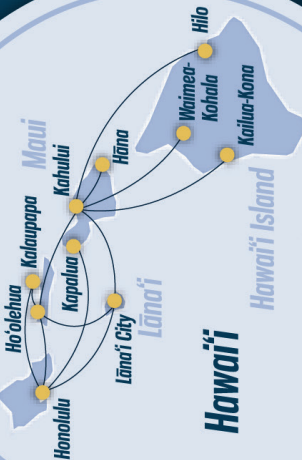
